

# Minutes of meeting of joint working party with Prudhoe Town Council on future of town centre held at Spetchells Centre on Tuesday21October at 7pm

**1 Minutes** of meeting held on 7<sup>22n</sup> May were agreed.

## 2 Matters arising:

- (i) Alan Wann presentation: agreed his talk was disappointing
- (ii) **20mph speed limit:** Gordon still pursuing.
- (iii) **Meeting with Richard Wearmouth:** Gordon to arrange.
- (iv) **Prudhoe Castle:** Tracy and Gordon reported difficulties in involving them.

**3 Consultation with traders.** Notes of the meeting with shop keepers held at Ginevras on 18<sup>th</sup> June were noted and welcomed.

#### **3 Visit to Stockton Town Centre**

George reported on achievements in regenerating the town centre which has been achieved through persistent leadership and direction over 10 years. Stockton MBC had bought up property, invested in infrastructure and run some facilities (eg a cycle hub) as loss leaders to bring in visitors. Copies of George's report are available.

#### 4 Town Centre shopping list

A list of practical steps for the short and medium term were agreed. These were based on the previous visioning exercise and consultation and all could be achieved with modest resources. They are attached to these minutes.

Members thought that some immediate steps to brighten up Front Street and improve frontages were warranted. George will seek quotes for design advice and Tracy and Gordon agreed to look into ways of creating a fund towards costs involved which could be matched by individual traders.

# Short term ( 2 years)

(actions we can take ourselves with modest funding and resources)

- Buildings painted brighten up frontages and painting murals
- More outside events markets, music, and more
- Life in the 'gap' by Mcgees Co op may be willing to sell
- 20mph speed limit through NCC to make more shopper friendly
- Clever parking time limits in centre and make shopping easier
- Town gateways to mark entry into the town
- Confident town brand to promote as shopping destination
- Childrens play area to make family friendly
- Involve the castle in the town for tourism potential

# Long term ( 10 years)

- Acquire empty properties for community purposes
- Improvements to Glade to make it more amenable for events
- Multi purpose performance space to build cultural identity
- Consider Pedestrianisation to make shopping friendly
- N Estates redevelopment in town centre hold talks at early stage
- Refurbishment of East Centre feasibility underway by PCP
- Improve round the town transport road trains???
- More car parking
- Bid for major events like Tour of Britain
